At the same time students will develop exam skills for assessments; recalling key factual information, explaining with examples and religious quotes will be a foundation block for their evaluation and appraisal of religion, faith and belief in practice. All of these skills will enable our explorers to finish their learning journey being able to apply these skills both verbally and practically.
