## Alternative Education:

There are 3 strands of Alternative Education:

1. Foundation Learning Tier called STEPs for some students in Years 9-11.

This includes the Asdan COPE Course, Adventure Based Learning and Preparation for Work Skills taught in school. Students study two option subjects of their choice.
2. Some students study PACE (Practical Assistance for Curriculum Enhancement) and one less option.
3. A bespoke curriculum is arranged for a very small number of students, who are usually educated off site or with 1:1 tuition.

Future Skills covers citizenship, RSE, careers, British values, health and well-being and 'living in the wider world' which is preparation for life in modern Britain and PSHE. This is taught via an afternoon session on a rotation and also through specific drop down days throughout the year

RE is taught to all students. Students sit a short course GCSE exam in Year 10.

All subjects taught in Years 9-11 are GCSEs, with the exception of Dance Performing Arts BTEC , Digital Information Technology BTEC, Health \& Social Care Cambridge National, Sports Studies Cambridge National and Enterprise \& Marketing Cambridge National

Students start their GCSE subjects in Year 9 with the majority taking 4 option subjects. One of these must be History or Geography.

Students in sets 1 and 2 for MFL in Year 8 are strongly encouraged to continue studying MFL in Years 9-11.

Students with an aptitude for science can opt for Separate Sciences as one of their free option choices in Years 9-11.
